#### **Behaviour and Attitudes**

In school we want all our children to feel safe and happy. We expect good behaviour and good manners. We know you feel this is important too and we thank you for your continued support promoting it. The **majority** of our children do follow the school rules and are verbally praised for doing so throughout the day, recognised with certificates, stickers, dojos and also through our Person of Outstanding Character (POOC) Award.

In fact, this week we have been celebrating the children who have shown real strength of character and a positive attitude towards school life this term. POOCs are great ambassadors for our school rules 'Be nice, work hard and never give up!' Well done to you all, we are so proud of you.

When the rules are not followed the children have to accept the consequences. Unacceptable behaviour includes ...

- · Lack of respect for adults/each other.
- Aggressive/physical behaviour.
- Reacting/retaliating to incidents.
- Damage to property or equipment.
- Swearing.
- Stealing.
- Refusing to follow instructions/expectations.
- Racist comments.
- Homophobic comments.
- Bullying.

At times, we find unacceptable behaviour can arise from children reacting or retaliating to an incident that they didn't start, that involved a friend or they were on the periphery of and often not fully aware of the bigger picture. Giving the message, that retaliating is okay is one fraught with difficulty and potential danger, particularly as they get older and are out and about in the community. Therefore, as positive role models we always tell the children not to retaliate with violence- verbal or physical, to walk away from any conflict and speak to an adult. I know this is a tricky subject, one of many parenting minefields, but we thank you for supporting us with our policy and procedures.

As a reminder, this year we will be celebrating Anti-bullying week beginning on Monday 13<sup>th</sup> November, by asking the children to come to school wearing odd socks – the brighter the better! We will be discussing how we can 'sock it' to the bullies, encouraging the children to work together to make a stand against bullying. Odd sock day is also a great way to

celebrate our differences. Diversity can sometimes be linked to bullying, so any opportunity to remind the children that we are all made differently and that this is to be proudly promoted. Whether it is the way we look, our race, beliefs or skin colour, neurodiversity, disability or sexual orientation – we are one big Greenleas family.

As the week progresses, we will work with our classes and in assemblies to 'Make some noise about bullying', which is this year's theme for the week.

During the week, we will take the time to revisit our school definition of bullying. This is vital for children to understand their own and others behaviour and to understand the difference between bullying and other playground issues.

We are proud at Greenleas to create a culture where bullying is not accepted and where staff step in swiftly to resolve issues. We encourage children to 'call out' bullying and to find a trusted member of staff to talk to when they have concerns. We will always work closely with parents to ensure that children are well supported as issues are resolved.
