Dear Parents and Carers,

Happy New Year, I hope this message finds you safe and well and that you and your family have had an enjoyable Christmas break. It has been lovely to welcome the children back to school. This week we have responded to a number of enquiries about Nursery and Wrap Around provision following communication shared by the management of Greenleas Pre-school/Owls Den. Please be assured, we do have plans to extend our provision in September 2024, but are waiting for the Local Authority legal paperwork to be served before we share anything. Our plans include expanding our outstanding EYFS provision into Nursery and building on the success of our current in-house Wrap Around Care provision for our school community. Further details will follow, however if you want to express an interest in places for either please contact us.

I am aware that there is a rumour that our Wrap Around Provision is full, this is not the case. As numbers have grown we have increased our staffing accordingly, which we will continue to do so. However there are times/sessions when we have had to cap our numbers and been unable to accommodate late bookings i.e. on the day / day before etc. due to staffing ratios.

#### Attendance

This week you may have seen the DfE press release on their National Drive to Improve School Attendance. Good attendance and punctuality underpin good progress: if children are not at school or miss parts of lessons, they cannot successfully access the curriculum offered and this can lead to them feeling anxious and out of touch with school life. It is your responsibility to ensure that a child of compulsory school age attends school both regularly and punctually. The diary dates below include all the school holidays and Staff Development Days for the remainder of this school year. National tests and teacher assessments take place in the months of May and June - family holidays should be avoided during this time.



Families who take children out of school during term time may be referred to the LA Attendance Team for the issuing of a Fixed Penalty Notice if an unauthorised absence takes attendance to below 97%. We know it might be tempting to report your child's absence as sickness rather than request LOA for a holiday – please be honest as our children love to talk and are excited to tell us they have just come back from Lapland, Disney, Spain etc. and if they don't tell, their friends do! Additionally, an international dialling tone is often a giveaway! We update children's attendance records with any additional information we receive.

Our whole school target is 97%. Autumn Term 2023 our whole school attendance was 96.1%. Last term 197 children had at least 96% attendance, with 86 of these achieving 100% attendance. Well done to these children, an amazing achievement!

The government class children whose attendance is 90% or below as persistent absentees. In the Autumn Term, 41 children's attendance falls into this bracket. As a school, we have a duty to inform you of attendance levels that are a concern so you may receive a letter highlighting this in order to work together to make plans to improve attendance. Please note, these letters are standard letters and do sound very formal.

When your child is unwell, it can be tricky deciding whether or not to keep them off school. If you do keep your child at home, please inform the school office by email or the in-app message facility on Arbor by 9:00am, stating your child's name, class and the nature of the illness.

Punctuality is just as important. Children who arrive after registers have been taken in class are marked on the register as Late (L code).

Being punctual to school has the following benefits:

- Encourages good life habits for years to come.
- Learning for your child is not interrupted they make a good start to the school day.
- Learning for other children is not interrupted. (Teachers do not have to stop their lessons).
- Children take part in all of their lessons.

Even a few minutes of lateness each day can have a negative impact on teaching and learning in the classroom. The table below shows what lateness might look like, on average:

Average mins late per day	Hours and minutes missed in one year due to lateness	This means this many lessons are missed in one year!
2 mins	6 hours and 20 mins	Around 6 to 7 lessons
3 mins	9 hours and 30 mins	Around 10 to 11 lessons
4 mins	13 hours	Around 14-15 lessons
5 mins	16 hours	Around 16-20 lessons

If you have a child who is due to start school in September 2024 the application deadline is looming. If you have any friends or family with children due to start, could you please remind them as well?
